
IVORVIOW: The primary goal of the Shenandoah Community School District's technology is to enrich the learning that takes place in and out of the classroom. Because technology is a vital part of the school district curriculum, uses of technology and the Internet will be expected of students, Student access to technology and the Internet allows for effective research, resource sharing, problem solving, innovation, communication and collaboration.

Equipment "District staff may collect and/or inspect the technology at any time, directly or by remote access."









Device Care:

- 1. Treat with care
- 2. When not using your computer, store in provided bag.
- 3. Keep device and bag clean.
- 4. In hallways, <u>ALWAYS</u> have your computer in your provided bag.

Students must always use the bags provided to carry Chromebook and zip it shut.

Please do not put other paper, pens, etc. in the bag.



- 5. When/if devices are taken out of school, store in a safe place.
- 6. Device cleaning should be done carefully. Use soft, dry lint free cloth when cleaning. Never use chemical cleaning products. Ask for help if you need it.

Device Care:

7. Please do not do anything to it that will alter the computer in anyway. Do not attempt to remove or change the physical structure of the device, including the keys, screen, or casing. If you do, you are responsible for 100% of the repair or replacement.




- 8. Keep devices away from food and drink.

- 10. You are the only one to use your computer....ever.




11. Please do not remove or interfere with the serial number or identification place on the computer.


12. ALWAYS remove device from the bag when charging! Ensure the device has air circulation while charging.






To create, send, share, access, or download material which is abusive, hateful, threatening, harassing, or sexually explicit.


















To forward email commonly known as "SPAM", Unsolicited Commercial Email (UCE), or "junk mail"

- 3. Suspension of network/Internet privileges for the remainder of the year.




- *Revocation of all technology use

- *Involvement of local law enforcement




Financial restitution for damage

Damage Scale: Students are responsible for district devices while in their possession. In the event of non-intentional damage to the computer that was not due to a machine defect, the device's responsible student/family will share in the cost for damages according to the following schedule.

- 1. First incident up to \$50.00
- 2. Second incident up to \$100.00
- 3. Third and final Full cost of repair or replacement.








Only the Technology Director or designee can install programs and apps to student devices.
