SCSD Leveled Response to COVID 19

This document is a summary of the district's Return to Learn Plan (R2L) plan and response to the COVID 19 Pandemic. It is important to note changes are made as we learn more about COVID 19 and guidance is provided from various agencies.

A personalized learning plan (PEP) will be developed to support student learning needs using online learning tools. Some students may attend onsite in small groups or alternate locations to receive specialized instruction. Attendance and participate on campus or remotely.
