# SCSD Leveled Response to COVID 19

This document is a summary of the district's Return to Learn Plan (R2L) plan and response to the COVID 19 Pandemic. It is important to note changes are made as we learn more about COVID 19 and guidance is provided from various agencies.

A personalized learning plan (PEP) will be developed to support student learning needs using online learning, instructional packets and activities, small group instruction (on and off campus), and other remote learning tools. Some students may attend onsite in small groups or alternate locations to receive specialized instruction. Attendance and participation will be required whether students participate on campus or remotely.  The use of face coverings is expected for all students and staff while they are in school settings, on the bus, or participating in school-sponsored activities in order to reduce the spread of COVID 19. Staff will be teaching students when face coverings are appropriate to use and how to wear them. There may be times when students and staff are required to wear face coverings when social distancing is more difficult to achieve. The school will provide face coverings for students. 		Disinfecting	<ul> <li>Avoid bare hand contact with any high touch surface</li> <li>Use barrier such as paper towel or clothing when bare hand contact is unavoidable</li> <li>Wash hands or apply sanitizer after touching high contact surfaces</li> <li>Enhanced disinfection, especially for high contact surfaces (door/other handles, light switches, bathroom fixtures)</li> <li>Desks and individual workstations will be wiped down at the beginning and end of the day</li> <li>Office areas will be "fogged" weekly</li> </ul>
